- Over 5,000 dogs and cats spayed/neutered through low-cost programs and collaborative efforts





## About Us

The **Michigan Animal Adoption Network** (MAAN), founded in 1994, is a licensed 501c3 non-profit organization comprised of two operations.

The **Adopt-A-Pet Network** is a resource working to place rescued and unwanted animals into new permanent homes. To date, we have placed over 6,210 animals.

The **Animal Care Network** (ACN) consists of teams of volunteers who hit the streets daily in Pontiac and Inkster rescuing and providing help to outdoor/indoor pets. The ACN has received

national acclaim and recognition for this unique program from Animal Planet, History Channel and Nickelodeon Channel.



The ACN provides low-cost spay/neuter and vaccination clinics in metro Detroit communities. More than 1,300 dogs and cats are typically vaccinated in one afternoon at a clinic.

The ACN is dedicated to saving the lives of cats and dogs, spaying and neutering, educating pet owners and working towards goals in collaboration with local animal shelters, animal



rescue organizations, community leaders, city workers, business and citizens. Volunteers are not only dedicated to rescuing the animals but also committed to rehabilitating animals.

The ACN has been providing animal aid for over 17 years. The program consists of volunteers who team up to venture into neighborhoods in search of animals and pet owners in need. The ACN has become a well-known source of assistance and advice for thousands of citizens in the area and is considered a place for many pet owners to come to for help. In fact, our low cost spay/neuter program always has a waiting list.



Teams load up with supplies—including doghouses, straw, food, water—to take to the animals. The ACN will act on complaints, but also drives the streets to find animals in need.

The program has guidelines. If pet owners insist on keeping their animals outdoors, the ACN will provide new dog houses if owners are willing to spay/neuter their dogs (at low cost). The response to this has been overwhelming. Over 5,000 cats and dogs have been sterilized within the Metro area alone. This has resulted in a huge decrease in the number of unwanted litters and strays.



If the ACN comes across a litter of puppies or kittens, we will offer to spay the mother for free if the litter is surrendered to the ACN. This has been a very successful part of the program. When conditions are severe, the ACN will attempt to rescue the animal(s) in need. A bad situation will not be forgotten or unresolved.



## Services and Assistance Provided

- Live trapping of stray cats and dogs

- Pet care education, community participation
